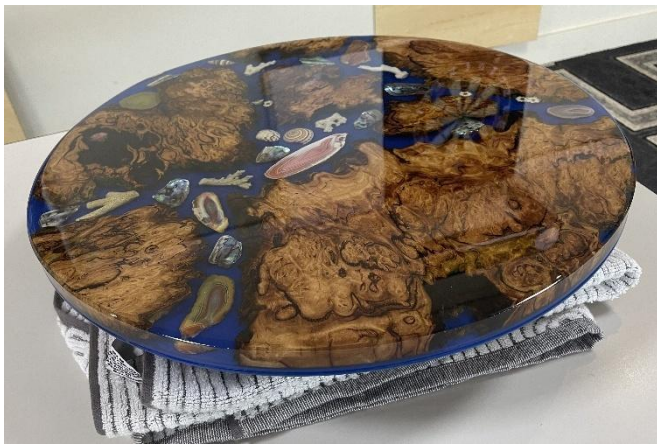


**Hastings Woodworkers Community

Below are items presented for Show and Tell.

Will Howard continues his use of resin to craft beautiful items. This time the item is a Lazy-Susanne for the centre of his family table. Care must be taken – room temp should be 15C or higher, need to remove any bubbles with metho and monitor there are no distortions in shape. Sometimes requires him to stay on task for hours. “If you want a job done right you must persevere”, Will emphasises.



Dave Wells has decided to craft two trays/cutting boards. Both have unique patterns. The critical point is to make such each cut is accurate. Finish is with food safe oil.



Jon Ward has been busy creating new ideas for his craft. Fridge magnets and coasters are the latest. Mixture of huon pine and red cedar timbers used with mirrortone finishes.





Steve Sessions was asked to make some door stops. Took awhile to determine the technique to use but soon learnt tricks to speed up the process. Used pine with a shellac finish.



George Campbell had some pen parts he wished to use. Crafted four pens with different timbers. One timber was from a burl with brittle grain which made the job difficult to complete. Mirrortone and wax finish.



Greg Scrivner demonstrated his carving skills by displaying a long hat rack. He used red cedar, which can be difficult to carve. He used Bio Wax as a finish. The cedar doesn't go dark. (I couldn't photograph the rack in one image)



Greg also displayed a Lathe Steady he crafted. To be used as part of special project he is to embark on. Used mixed timber, including plywood.
